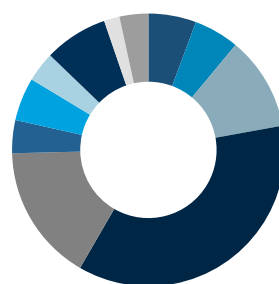

WHAT DOES THE FUND INVEST IN?

The Fund invests primarily in securities of larger capitalization Canadian companies. Treasury bills or short-term investments, not exceeding three years to maturity, may also be used from time to time. There are no specific limits on the portion of the Fund's assets that may be directly invested in foreign securities or indirectly exposed to investments in foreign securities. However, as of the date hereof, the Fund is focused on investing in Canadian securities and the Fund's exposure to foreign securities, if any, is only through indirect investments. In addition, as at the date hereof, Mawer does not expect to invest more than 15% of the Fund's net asset value in foreign securities in ordinary circumstances.

The charts give you a snapshot of the Fund's investments as of March 31, 2017. The Fund's investments will change.

HOW RISKY IS IT?

The value of the Fund can go down as well as up. You could lose money.

One way to gauge risk is to look at how much a fund's returns change over time. This is called "volatility".

In general, funds with higher volatility will have returns that change more over time. They typically have a greater chance of losing money and may have a greater chance of higher returns. Funds with lower volatility tend to have returns that change less over time. They typically have lower returns and may have a lower chance of losing money.

RISK RATING

Mawer has rated the volatility of this Fund as **Medium to High**.

This rating is based on how much the Fund's returns have changed from year to year. It doesn't tell you how volatile the Fund will be in the future. The rating can change over time. A fund with a low risk rating can still lose money.

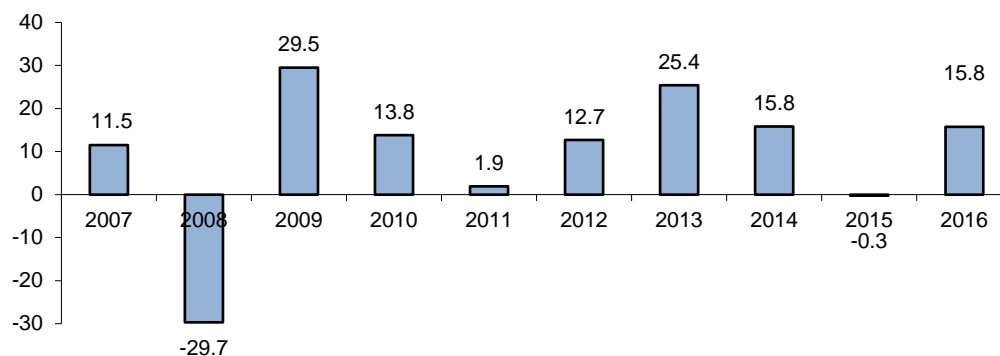
Like most mutual funds, this Fund doesn't have any guarantees. You may not get back the amount of money you invest.

HOW HAS THE FUND PERFORMED?

This section tells you how Series A units of the Fund have performed over the past 10 years. Returns are after expenses have been deducted. These expenses reduce the Fund's returns.

YEAR-BY-YEAR RETURNS

This chart shows how Series A units of the Fund have performed in each of the past 10 years. The series dropped in value in 2 of the 10 years. The range of returns and change from year to year can help you assess how risky the Fund has been in the past. It does not tell you how the Fund will perform in the future.



Best and worst 3-months returns

This table shows the best and worst returns for Series A units of the Fund in a 3-month period over the past 10 years. The best and worst 3-month returns could be higher or lower in the future. Consider how much of a loss you could afford to take in a short period of time.

AVERAGE RETURN

A person who invested \$1,000 in Series A units of the Fund 10 years ago would have \$2,184.87 on March 31, 2017. This works out to an annual compound return of 8.13%.

WHO IS THIS FUND FOR?

Investors who:

- are looking for a long-term, equity investment
- want to invest in mid and large sized Canadian companies
- can handle the ups and downs of the stock market



Don't buy this Fund if you need a steady source of income from your investment.

A WORD ABOUT TAX

In general, you'll have to pay income tax on any money you make on a fund. How much you pay depends on the tax laws where you live and whether or not you hold the fund in a registered plan, such as a Registered Retirement Savings Plan or a Tax-Free Savings Account.

Keep in mind that if you hold your fund in a non-registered account, fund distributions are included in your taxable income, whether you get them in cash or have them reinvested.

HOW MUCH DOES IT COST?

The following tables show the fees and expenses you could pay to buy, own and sell Series A units of the Fund. The fees and expenses – including any commissions – can vary among series of a fund and among funds. Higher commissions can influence representatives to recommend one investment over another. Ask about other funds and investments that may be suitable for you at a lower cost.

1. SALES CHARGES

No sales charges apply when you purchase units directly through Mawer. If you purchase units through another representative, your representative may charge you a sales commission when you purchase Series A units of the Fund. The sales commission is negotiable between you and your representative.

2. FUND EXPENSES

You don't pay these expenses directly. They affect you because they reduce the Fund's returns.

As of December 31, 2016, the Fund's expenses were 1.21% of its value. This equals \$12.10 for every \$1,000 invested.

More about the trailing commission – No trailing commission is paid in respect of Series A units.

3. OTHER FEES

You may have to pay other fees when you buy, hold, sell or switch units of the Fund.

If units of the Fund are redeemed within 90 days of purchase, the Fund may, at our discretion, retain an amount equal to 2% of the net asset value for the series of units redeemed.

WHAT IF I CHANGE MY MIND?

Under securities law in some provinces and territories, you have the right to:

- withdraw from an agreement to buy mutual fund units within two business days after you receive a simplified prospectus or Fund Facts document, or
- cancel your purchase within 48 hours after you receive confirmation of the purchase.

In some provinces and territories, you also have the right to cancel a purchase, or in some jurisdictions, claim damages, if the simplified prospectus, annual information form, Fund Facts document or financial statements contain a misrepresentation. You must act within the time limit set by the securities law in your province or territory.
